If you require access or essential companion tickets, please call 0161 817 4531.


Seating

When you enter the performance space, you can choose where to sit.


The seating will be **chairs** in a circle.

During the performance there will be **video on the screens** and the performer in the centre will be speaking.



You will not be able to see everything at once, this is part of the performance.



This performance contains **bright flashing** lights and haze.
